






Completed Tier 2 ToT and planning to scaling up




Preferred types of WB support needed to scale up the ToT Rollout:




How often EduCoP webinars should be conducted

Conclusions:

- 1. Major part of PULSAR participating countries took certain actions aiming to scale-up the IPSAS ToT program. Some countries are in the process of planning their training or dissemination; however, progress has slowed down due to the COVID-19 pandemic and related lockdowns.
- 2. There is strong interest to continue sharing experiences of PSA education from PULSAR EduCoP member countries and good practices from around the world.



Public Sector Accounting Education Progress Update

Four IPSAS ToT training sessions were held in Vienna, Tirana, Sarajevo and Batumi. 79 participants were trained by ACCA and the end of course assessment pass rate was 97%.

Online IPSAS Certification course by ACCA has been provided to PULSAR members. To date over 60 have passed and remaining participants have been provided a 6 months extension to complete the course.

2021 Workplan

- Strengthening collaborations with strategic institutions providing PSA education to identify partnerships with PULSAR member countries on the following:
 - IPSAS online courses to scale up country training programs
 - Learning materials that include case studies and practical guides or manual for PSA trainers.
 - IPSAS-based model curriculum/syllabus that can be used by PSA education providers.
- Having virtual SITs to share good examples of PSA education and successful implementation of IPSAS.
