





### The Government of Ukraine has become one the participants on the PULSE Framework pilot testing

- The decision was made based on the conviction that the most difficult times demand multiplying of education and innovation level
- > PSA efficiency determines the PFM success
- Digitalisation of processes simplifies significantly not only PSA implementation but also PSA system management



#### Benefits of the PULSE assessment



- Systemic data collection on the current efficiency of the PSA framework, standards and practices
- Assessment of conceptual and actual compliance with IPSAS
- > Performance check of the current PSA framework using web-based assessment tool
- ➤ Using the assessment to develop policy recommendations and plan actions for further strengthening of the PSA framework and practice

The materials necessary for the research and assessment (accounting policy, financial reporting packages for the examined period, etc.) were received shortly, the Ministries teams worked quickly and shared additional information during the consultation meetings with the assessment team



All dimensions assessed were according to the PULSE Framework within the approved timeline. The scoring was valid and the team provided evidence for their scores

*The total of 102 conceptual indicators* **and 77 actual indicators** of PSA were assessed



Current assessment confirms assessments carried out in Ukraine earlier: the overall assessment of reform, regulation status, and implementation of the accounting best practices is determined at the B+ level

#### **CONCEPTUAL LEVEL ASSESSMENT RESULTS**




More than 80% of dimensions received scores A-C which points to quite high level of IPSAS implementation in the national standards of Ukraine as well as high level of actions in line with aspirations to develop PSA

#### **ACTUAL LEVEL ASSESSMENT RESULTS**



More than 75% of dimensions received A-C scores which points to quite high level of practical application of IPSAS in the national practice of PSA in Ukraine







As PSA assessment according to the PULSE framework in Ukraine is a pilot project, the developers received comments and proposals on PULSE web-based tool improvement during the assessment process

### Based on the results of the PSA assessment in Ukraine, the key objectives and prospects were identified:

- ✓ It is necessary to continue national standards update in line with changes in IPSAS as well as preparation and approval of the new standards
- ✓ Implemented CPD for accountants should be carried out on the ongoing basis.

  Trainings on full and proper application of national standards are necessary
- ✓ PSA software should be developed and integrated with other PFM software systems
