FOREWORD

The third <u>Forum of Public Oversight Bodies</u> (POB Forum) is organized jointly under two flagship programs of the World Bank Centre for Financial Reporting Reform (<u>CFRR</u>) based in Vienna, Austria: the Road to Europe Program of Accounting Reform and Strengthening Institutions for Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (<u>REPARIS for SMEs</u>) and the Enhancing Accounting, Auditing, and Sustainability Reporting (<u>EAASURE</u>) Program.

The POB Forum was established in May 2023 under REPARIS for SMEs, aiming to improve audit quality in Western Balkan countries through learning, exchange of experience, and regional cooperation. It facilitates sharing of international and regional knowledge and experience in the field of public oversight and quality assurance.

This platform is now supported by the EAASURE regional program, involving the competent authorities from 11 participating countries: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, Kosovo, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, and Ukraine.

The *target audience of the POB Forum* includes representatives of ministries of finance responsible for accounting and audit legislation; executive staff, board members, and quality assurance inspectors of public audit oversight authorities; as well as representatives of professional accounting organizations (PAOs) with responsibilities delegated by a POB related to quality assurance or other tasks.

The specific objectives of the POB Forum on October 22 and 23 are to:

- Learn from the experience of Romania in transposing the European Union (EU) accounting and auditing acquis and institutionalizing a framework for audit oversight and quality assurance in line with EU provisions.
- Learn from the experience of Serbia in establishing a public oversight and quality assurance system.

- Advance the discussion on the increasing role and impact of artificial intelligence (AI) in corporate financial reporting, audit, and quality assurance.
- Learn from each other on formulating remediation actions for significant findings identified by quality assurance inspections.

The expected results are that knowledge and experience gained from this event should: (i) support the further alignment of countries' corporate financial reporting frameworks with relevant EU Directives and regulations, and (ii) improve the practice of identifying significant findings through quality assurance inspections and formulating appropriate remediation actions.

Within one month after this event, each country delegation will be invited to provide feedback and explain how their participation in the POB Forum has contributed to the reform agenda in their country, what is better or different because of the capacity-building support, and the likely sustainability of the presumed increases in knowledge, skills, and competence in individuals, groups, or organizations. Such feedback should inform the frequency, approach, and topics covered in subsequent POB Forums.

The language of the event is English with simultaneous interpretation into Albanian, Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian, Russian and Romanian (on Day 1).
