

Creating a Shared Platform for Dialogue

- Committee, working group, or informal network
- Address expectations + challenges early
- Foster curriculum alignment
- Reduce surprises in qualification/accreditation reviews





Aligning Curriculum Through Collaboration

- Map academic content to IES
- Surface gaps & strengths together
- Learn across sectors (terminology, depth)
- Reflect evolving professional practice
- Example: Georgia's mapping workshops





Bringing Professional Practice into the Classroom

- Guest lectures & real-world case studies
- Mentorship & career awareness early on
- Co-developed modules with firms & PAOs

Examples:

MIA: Industry speakers in courses KICPAA: University partnerships AM CAAA: Joint exam prep support





Supporting Faculty Development Through the PAO–University Relationship

- Train lecturers on ethics, audit & standards
- Co-develop workshops & faculty training
- Invite professors to CPD sessions
- Share PAO-developed materials

Building Structures for Ongoing Communication

- Go beyond formal reviews make it ongoing
- Use check-ins, joint events, and working groups
- Enable early feedback + shared understanding Example:
